The trophy for the most successful exhibiting photographer was won by David Sargent of Ascot Waters who also carried off the most successful WA exhibitor.

"David Sargent is one of the most impressive photographers in Western Australian camera clubs and we always look forward to his entries and we are thrilled he has taken away the two big prizes this year" says Competition Director, Maureen Ivimey.

Jemma Haran of Wanneroo Senior High School carried off the first prize to claim the prestigious Youth Prints Australian Photographic Society Herbert Medallion.

"We were thrilled with the overall excellent standard of entries submitted by these talented youngsters," says Maureen.

The Australian Photographic Society Silver Plaque was awarded to Victorian Arthur Lilley for Best Print.

The award for Nature Prints went to Ivor Metlitzky of Sorrento while Bronwyn Cooke of Kununurra claimed the Australian Rural Life Prints section.

Eastern sea boarders James Lu of NSW took away the first placing for Creative/Altered Reality and Evonne Smith of SA led the field with Open Mono Prints.

The photographs will be on display for the duration of the Show in the Wilkinson Pavilion. The public are invited to vote for their favourite photography under the People's Choice banner. Their selection will see the winning exhibitor receive \$500.
