

SHOW STATISTICS

- It is expected that close to 400,000 people will have visited the 2009 Smoke Free Perth Royal Show.
- A bull calf, 4 kid goats and 3 emu chicks were born at the Baby Animal Nursery.
- Kid goats and calves at the Farm Animal Kingdom drank their way through almost 500 litres of milk formula a day.
- 17 chicks and 8 ducklings hatched at the Farm Animal Farm Kingdom.
- 13,000 orange juice samples were given out at the Harvey Fresh stand at the IGA Fresh from WA Pavilion.
- 2500 WA olive oil samples were given out a day.
- Sweeter Bananas sold 500 banana smoothies every day.
- A nine-year-old girl was the youngest exhibitor in the Open Art competition.
- More than 15,000 entries were received by more than 40 competitions.
- ABC weather and radio presenter Russell Woolf won first prize for his rumballs in the cookery competition.
- 72,000 mini muffins were given to showgoers in the IGA Fresh from WA Pavilion.
- About 50 tonnes of barbecued sausage were sampled by showgoers each day of the Show.
- There were 800 entertainment performances.
- 13, 500 eggs were decorated on the IGA Follow the Yellow Brick Road.
- Mundella Foods gave out approximately 3000 yoghurt samples over two days.
- In the Dairy Pavilion, Harvey Fresh sampled more than 360 litres of custard over two days, more than 100kg of cheese over the week and more than 300kg of yoghurt over the week. Heritage Country Cheese of Balingup sampled more than 70kg of cheese over the week.
- People ate their way through 900L of ice cream from South Hedland's Frogs Gelato. The most popular flavour was bubblegum, followed by chocolate, vanilla and ferrero. Their 2009 award-winning coffee gelato was also a firm favourite.
- Showgoers tasted 15,000 cups of Brownes milk (flavoured + plain), yoghurt and custard.
- Chook Washer Jim Finger has washed and blow dried 30 chooks over the eight days.
- 320 tonnes of manure was created from animal waste.
- 14,000 families participated in the IGA Follow the Yellow Brick Road.
